Spirit's Call Choir began in an "Explorations of the Self" workshop with Dorothy Becker and Margaret Tobin in November 2000 at St. Norbert Arts Centre when people who had been told they could NOT sing found their voices and decided to form a choir. Our belief is that singing is the birthright of everyone! The choir offers a supportive environment for remembering, reclaiming and celebrating the spirit and voice of one and all!

In the fall of 2001, gifted musician and choral director Lyle Eide joined the choir. Lyle helped us develop a rich harmonic sound and prepare for our FIRST full-length concert—our sold out benefit for NEST on November 30, 2003. The choir is delighted to present its second annual benefit concert for NEST here tonight!

Spirit's Call's non-audition choir continues to grow and change each season as more new members join us and our singing experiences evolve. Spirit's Call Choir now includes novice to accomplished singers and musicians among its 135 voices and welcomes all who want to find their voice and "Sing for the Joy!"

Internationally acclaimed musical director and composer Alex Kirov prepared and directed the choir for our concert on April 19, 2004—part of the peace choirs initiative linked to the visit of the Dalai Lama to Canada. That event was a sold out benefit for Miriam Centre—to support women and children who have experienced violence and poverty.

Alex also directed our performance on May 28, 2004 at the Canadian Counselling Association's national conference on the theme of "Illuminating Practice: Spirituality, Story and Song."

News from NEST



The North End Sponsorship Team (NEST) is a cooperative ministry of six Lutheran and two United Church congregations plus individual members who want to invest time, energy or material resources to provide safe haven for refugees in Canada. NEST sponsorships are arranged through Canadian Lutheran World Relief, our "Sponsorship Agreement Holder" with the federal Department of Citizenship and Immigration. NEST also works in cooperation with Welcome Place and other groups involved in bringing refugees to Canada.

During the past year, NEST has welcomed two new families. Sponsorships are for a period of one year from the date of arrival in Canada.

Father, mother and three children from Togo – After fleeing their own country, the family spent some years in Ghana. The two older children began school in English. They came to Winnipeg on February 12, 2004. NEST provides all care, household goods and financial support. The father is fluent in French, Geman and English, and has taught German. NEST is assisting him to establish his teaching credentials here. He is also seeking other types of work. The mother also hopes to find employment. She speaks French and some English. The two older children attend a French school near their home. All are doing well.

A couple from the Democratic Republic of Congo, and daughter – In early 2003, NEST undertook the sponsorship of this family which included two children. Sadly, their son died from illness in August just before he turned 13. Due to food shortages and other difficulties, the daughter was cared for by relatives while they waited to come to Canada. When the time came to leave, she was unable to rejoin them. They made a heart-breaking decision to come without her, arriving in Winnipeg on May 19, 2004. They and NEST strive to bring their daughter who will be 12 years old Dec. 11. Recent unrest in Abidjan, where her case is being processed may cause more delays. Meanwhile, the husband is taking a Health Care Aide course in French at St. Boniface College, and studying English in the evening. Mother began the same course, but became ill and hopes to resume in January.

NEST also has in process five "family-linked" sponsorships of sixteen people from Eritrea, Somalia, and Congo. NEST is the official sponsor but the family here is willing and able to provide all care and financial support when their relatives arrive. Approval of these cases by Citizenship and Immigration can take as long as three to four years and is sometimes denied.

Currently NEST is considering a new full sponsorship. Monies raised through tonight's concert are very much needed to help finance this. We thank you sincerely for your support.
