About Spirit's Call Choir



Spirit's Call Choir supports:

PERSONAL HARMONY—singing to bring balance and joy to our inner being CHORAL HARMONY—singing to create beautiful sound in our vocal community GLOBAL HARMONY—singing to support transformation, justice and peace

Spirit's Call Choir began in an "Explorations of the Self" workshop with Margaret Tobin and Dorothy Becker in November 2000 at St. Norbert Arts Centre when people who had been told they could NOT sing found their voices and decided to form a choir. The choir's belief is that singing is the birthright of everyone. With their spirited enthusiasm and glorious sounds, it is clear that this choir definitely CAN sing!! From 9 original members, Spirit's Call Choir has grown to over 155 voices and includes novice to accomplished singers and musicians. The choir offers a supportive environment for remembering and celebrating the spirit and voice of one and all and welcomes all who want to find their voice and sing for joy.

Spirit's Call Choir has a special relationship with NEST. The first NEST benefit concert in November 2003 marked the choir's first full length concert performance. Partnering with NEST is an ideal fit for the choir's global harmony vision. Spirit's Call Choir also sings for other community and global causes, has performed at two national conferences and is delighted to present its 5th annual benefit concert for NEST here today.

On June 18, 2005, Spirit's Call Choir launched its long-awaited first CD "Spirit's Call Choir—Together in Harmony" in Winnipeg with 2 live performances at The Forks. Part of the CD was recorded at the 2nd NEST concert in November 2004.

Spirit's Call's non-audition community choir continues to grow and change each season as more new members join and its singing experiences evolve. The original musical director Lyle Eide (fall seasons 2001-04) brought the choir from singing along to CD's to the concert stage. The remarkable talent of director Alex Kirov (spring 2004) was a major contribution to the choir's experience. Michael Kurek became musical director in January 2005 and the choir's sound developed significantly through his creativity. Jeremy Vallance officially became musical director in September 2006. Thanks to Jeremy's many musical and personal gifts, the choir has continued to grow and thrive and has become what you are experiencing here today.

Spirit's Call Choir welcomes new members for the spring season—starting January 20, 2008. The new member orientation is at 2 pm on January 20th. The full choir sings from 2:30 to 4:30 pm (January 20th and weekly - Sunday afternoons.) at the Unitarian Church—603 Wellington Crescent (at Maryland/Academy—looks like a house.) Those who love to sing and those who always thought they couldn't are equally welcome!

The choir is a Winnipeg offering of *Spirit's Call*^M, which was founded in 1996 by Merv Campone and Dorothy Becker to contribute to the transformation of consciousness and support personal and universal harmony and balance through the integration of healing, learning and the arts. Spirit's Call is based in Vancouver and Winnipeg.

The Spirit's Call Collection includes the book Spirit's Call—When the Spirit Touches the Soul, the relaxation CD Spirit's Call—A Companion for Healing and an original art card. These are on display in the foyer today and available for purchase with the choir's CD.

News from NEST



NEST is a cooperative ministry of 6 Lutheran and 2 United church congregations plus individual members who work in harmony to sponsor and welcome refugees into our midst. Since last December's concert NEST has welcomed 6 more sponsorships with 22 persons bringing the total sponsorships to 37 with 134 persons from 18 countries: Afghanistan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Burma, Burundi, Colombia, Congo, El Salvador, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iran, Iraq, Kosovo, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Togo, and Vietnam. We currently have several other sponsorships in process or under active consideration.

NEST sponsorships are normally arranged through Canadian Lutheran World Relief, our "Sponsorship Agreement Holder" with the Canadian Department of Citizenship and Immigration. NEST also works in cooperation with Welcome Place and other groups bringing refugees to Canada. Most of our sponsorships are for one year from the date of arrival in Canada.

Proceeds from the last Spirit's Call Benefit concert, more than \$10,500, helped NEST to complete three sponsorships: a family of four from Kosovo, two brothers from the Congo and three young women (two sisters and a cousin) from Burundi. NEST is presently caring for a mother, 3 sons and 2 daughters from the Congo and a journalist and his wife from Ethiopia. Recent arrivals from Burma are a mother with 2 daughters and 3 sons, and a father and mother with 4 sons and a daughter. As well NEST welcomed the mother of previously sponsored refugees from the Congo. NEST is grateful for all safe arrivals, a record number in the space of one year.

NEST is grateful to the *Spirit's Call* choir for promoting *Global Harmony* and singing for refugees. The world continues to produce refugees in need of your help. NEST is limited in the number of sponsorships by finances and especially by the number of volunteers available for caregiving. We would welcome volunteers to join a caregiving team, usually a 1-year commitment
