Musical Director: Jeremy Vallance Program Director: Margaret Tobin **Hands of Hope** is a community-based initiative that seeks to fill a large gap in services for those most disadvantaged in Winnipeg. The organization uses a van and trailer funded by the Winnipeg Foundation to pick up donated items and delivers them to families in need.

Hands of Hope is mostly a volunteer organization supported by individual donors. It received financial support from the federal government for the wages for two persons. This ran out in March, 2007. Hands of Hope also has been assisted by various businesses, churches, foundations, (please see a partial listing at the website – www.handsofhope.ca) Many individuals volunteer their time to help support Hands of Hope with deliveries, pickups and administrative services.

Spirit's Call Choir's vision is to sing for personal, choral and global harmony. It contributes to global harmony by supporting worthy projects in Winnipeg and around the world - in song and financially. The choir is delighted to sing for Hands of Hope today, to support those most in need in Winnipeg. Previously, its 4 benefit concerts for NEST (North End Sponsorship Team) supported refugees settling in Winnipeg. The choir sang for Sisters in Spirit, to raise awareness about missing and murdered Aboriginal women, and for the greening of North Point Douglas. A benefit concert for Miriam Centre in conjunction with the visit of the Dalai Lama to Canada in 2004 supported women and children who had experienced poverty and violence. From its Global Harmony Development Fund, the choir contributed to Simunye, a Winnipeg linked organization in South Africa supporting those affected by HIV, to the OSU Children's Library Fund that promotes literacy in the poorest areas of Ghana, to Tsunami relief and to Acorn Gardens, a rural Manitoba project for adults and children who have experienced trauma and war. From 9 original members, Spirit's Call Choir has grown to over 130 voices and includes novice to accomplished singers and musicians. The choir offers a supportive environment for remembering and celebrating the spirit and voice of one and all.

Spirit's Call Choir welcomes new members in fall 2007. Season starts September 9. Orientation for new members is 2-2:30 pm. Full choir 2:30-4:30 pm. The choir meets weekly – Sunday afternoons – at the Unitarian Church – 603 Wellington Crescent - and welcomes all who want to find their voice and "Sing for Joy!" Also visit www.spiritscall.com.
