Spirit's Call Choir has a special relationship with NEST. Partnering with NEST is an ideal fit for the choir's global harmony vision. The first NEST benefit concert in November 2003 marked the choir's first full-length concert performance. The choir is delighted to present its 6th annual benefit concert for NEST here today. Spirit's Call Choir also performs regularly for various other community and global causes and has sung at two national conferences held in Winnipeg.

Spirit's Call's non-audition community choir continues to grow and change each season as more new members join and gifted directors contribute their unique musical gifts. Jeremy Vallance took over as musical director in spring 2006. Under Jeremy's enthusiastic leadership, the choir has been growing and thriving and has become what you are experiencing here today. Previous musical directors Michael Kurek, Alex Kirov and Lyle Eide also made significant contributions to the choir's development.

On June 18, 2005, Spirit's Call Choir launched its long-awaited first CD "Spirit's Call Choir – Together in Harmony" at The Forks in Winnipeg. Part of the CD was recorded at our 2nd NEST concert in November 2004. This CD is available for sale in the foyer today. The choir is currently working on the release of its 2nd CD.

Spirit's Call Choir began in an "Explorations of the Self" workshop with Margaret Tobin and Dorothy Becker in November 2000 at St. Norbert Arts Centre when people who had been told they could NOT sing found their voices and decided to form a choir. The choir was founded on the principle that singing is the birthright of everyone. From 9 original members, Spirit's Call Choir has grown to over 160 voices and includes novice to accomplished singers and musicians. The choir offers a supportive environment for remembering, reclaiming and celebrating the spirit and voice of one and all and welcomes all who want to find their voice and "Sing for Joy!"

Spirit's Call Choir welcomes new members for the spring season - starting January 18, 2009. The orientation for new members is at 2 pm January 18th. The full choir sings from 2:30 to 4:30 pm January 18 and weekly (Sunday afternoons) at the Unitarian Church (603 Wellington Crescent – at Maryland/Academy – looks like a house!) Those who love to sing and those who always thought they couldn't are equally welcome!

News from NEST



NEWS from NEST 2008

NEST is a cooperative ministry of eight congregations plus individual members who work in harmony to sponsor and welcome refugees into our midst. Since it began in 1986, NEST has welcomed 37 sponsorships to Winnipeg for a total of 134 persons from 18 countries including Afghanistan, Bosnia-Herzegovina, Burma, Burundi, Colombia, Congo, El Salvador, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iran, Iraq, Kosovo, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, Togo, and Vietnam.

NEST sponsorships are normally arranged through Canadian Lutheran World Relief, our "Sponsorship Agreement Holder" with the Canadian Department of Citizenship and Immigration. NEST also works in cooperation with Welcome Place and other groups bringing refugees to Canada. Sponsorships are usually for one year from the date of arrival in Canada, but may be longer in special situations.

Proceeds from the last Spirit's Call Benefit concert helped NEST with five sponsorships. They were a mother and 5 children from the Congo, a journalist and his wife from Ethiopia and the mother of previously sponsored refugees from the Congo. From Burma a mother with 2 daughters and 3 sons, and a father and mother with 4 sons and a daughter arrived in November 2007.

NEST has agreed to five full sponsorships for 21 more people - two families from the Congo and two families and a young man from Sudan - as well as seven family linked sponsorships (19 people). Canada Immigration must approve these refugees for entry into Canada, a process that can take several years, and may be denied.

The first Spirit's Call concert in support of refugees and NEST took place on November 30, 2003, exactly 5 years ago today. It was at Lutheran Church of the Cross, and brought in \$4,830.02. A year later, November 25, 2004 the concert was at Bethel Mennonite Church with net proceeds of \$6,406.36. In January, 2006 at North Kildonan Mennonite Church net income was \$9,466.29. That same year, in December at Knox United Church Spirit's Call Choir brought in net proceeds of \$10,121.64, a record that still holds.

Last year, the concert at Jubilee Place Auditorium, MBCI, had net proceeds of \$8,869.07. Net proceeds from all concerts include ticket sales and donations from individuals and from the choir. Total net income for the five concerts is \$39,693.38. Wow!

NEST's Balance Sheet for the five full sponsorships NEST has committed to over the next years shows Assets of \$45,787.37 and Obligations of \$108,578.59, which leaves us looking for \$62,791.22. While committing to these families, we have struggled with and had to refuse many similar requests.

NEST is grateful to the Spirit's Call choir for promoting Global Harmony and singing for refugees. The world continues to produce refugees in need of our help. NEST is limited in the number of sponsorships by finances and especially by the number of volunteers available for caregiving. We would welcome volunteers to join a caregiving team, usually a 1-year commitment.
