International Day of Peace (IDP) recognized by the United Nations occurs September 21 every year and is celebrated by many organizations around the world. WPP is a standing committee of Rotary International District 5550 Inc. There are over 500 Rotary Districts in the world with over 34,000 clubs.

A key component of WPP work is supporting educational programs that encourage a more sustainable and peaceful world, beginning with the awareness that responsibility for peace begins with oneself. The objective of the projects of WPP is to encourage and foster the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace - one person at a time.

WPP focus is to promote international understanding by bringing together people from different countries and cultures, different faiths, NGOs, educational institutions, businesses and professions and other groups of human beings of all types in ways and for purposes that will contribute to peace, justice and human rights.

District 5550 is an international centre for peace building and human rights.

About Bluesky Woman/ Morning Star (Grandmother Carol)


