Founding Vision

Margaret's Choir is a Winnipeg offering of Spirit's Call [™] founded in Vancouver in 1996 by Margaret Tobin, Merv Campone and Dorothy Becker. The goal is the transformation of consciousness in of support personal and universal harmony and balance through the integration of healing, learning and the arts. Spirit's Call Choir was founded on the principle that singing is the birthright of everyone.

The Little Choir That Could

Spirit's Call Choir began as an "Explorations of the Self" workshop with Margaret Tobin and Dorothy Becker in November 2000 when people who thought they couldn't sing found their voices and decided to form a choir with its first Musical Director, Lyle Eadie in 2001.

The choir has grown from 9 to 160 voices. As well as welcoming uncertain singers, the choir now includes novices and accomplished singers and musicians – all who love singing in community for the joy of it - and to benefit others.

Winnipeg's Spirit's Call Choir, renamed Margaret's Choir after Margaret Tobin, who passed away Dec. 21, 2014 from breast cancer, makes real her founding vision to raise funds for development work through the joy of singing.
