About Margaret's Choir

Margaret's Choir is an inclusive, non-audition community choir that supports: personal harmony - to bring balance and joy to our inner being choral harmony - to create beautiful vocal sound in community global harmony - to support equality, justice and peace

Founding Vision

Margaret's Choir is a Winnipeg offering of Spirit's Call TM founded in Vancouver in 1996 with the goal of transformation of consciousness in support of personal and universal harmony and balance through the integration of healing, learning and the arts. Spirit's Call Choir was founded on the principle that singing is the birthright of everyone.

Background

Spirit's Call Choir began as an "Explorations of the Self" workshop with Margaret Tobin and Dorothy Becker in 2000. A small group of people who thought they couldn't sing found their voices and formed the choir with our first Musical Director, Lyle Eide in 2001.

The choir grew from 9 to 160 voices. As well as welcoming uncertain singers, the choir now includes novice to accomplished singers and musicians – all who love singing in community for the joy of it and to benefit others.

Spirit's Call Choir, renamed **Margaret's Choir** after founder Margaret Tobin (1946-2014) makes real her vision to raise funds for development work.

Benefit Concerts

Margaret's Choir raises funds for organizations with charitable status through two benefit concerts a year. To date the choir has raised over \$ 201,000.00 for local and global causes. Previous concerts have supported development projects for refugee families settling in Winnipeg, and agencies helping women, children, youth and families in the inner-city.

Nathan Poole - Musical Director

Hailing from St. Paul, Minnesota, Nathan has conducted and performed as artistic director of several choral groups including Prairie Voices and the Central Manitoba Youth Choir. He has sung for Henry Engbrecht and Dr. Elroy Friesen, traveling across Canada and to the United Kingdom with the University Singers. In addition to Margaret's Choir, he is in his seventh year of service as Director of Music at Westminster United Church. Nathan loves to teach, and currently offers lessons in violin and piano to a number of children and adults in Winnipeg.

Charmaine Bacon - Pianist

Charmaine Bacon is the music director and organist at St. Bartholomew Anglian Church. She is a classically trained pianist and flutist currently studying organ with Lottie Enns-Braun. Charmaine is the pianist for Margaret's Choir under the direction of Nathan Poole, and the Silver Notes Choir directed by Marilyn Mensforth. She is on faculty at the Manitoba Conservatory of Music and Arts as flute instructor and teaches privately in River Heights. She performs as solvist in the Wind Chamber Concert Series at Crescent Fort Rouge United and as flutist and piccoloist in the Winnipeg Wind Ensemble.

About LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse

The LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse team, Woman Healing For Change and Council of Women Winnipeg would like to thank Margaret's Choir and all of the audience today. The proceeds of this amazing concert will become part of the capital we need to build the LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse for our North End babies to 5 year olds and their caregivers.

LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse has grown out of the weekly and year round (NESP) North End Stay and Play for babies to 5 and their caregivers. NESP has been running for over 7 years. We have listened closely and carefully to our families. Our families have told us that they want to hold onto their children and attend with them. When the parent is working or going to school, auntie, Kokum, cousin, neighbour, adult sibling, uncle, Nana, etc. brings the child. We are becoming the "ATTACHMENT Village" with a cast of supporters for our North End children.

In 2017, a new, custom-built LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse will begin construction and become part of the education boom erupting on Selkirk Ave. Our LITTLE STARS and their caregivers are LEARNING TOGETHER THROUGH PLAY. Play is SO important to healthy child development, that it has been recognized by the United Nations as the right of every child. Through PLAY our children and their caregivers learn: to solve problems, to be creative, to have a healthy and organized attachment and to be with others in healthy relationships. Play strengthens family bonds and in doing so, teaches children to become nurturing parents themselves. But play is something often taken for granted. Not every child has the opportunity to explore play in a safe and stimulating environment. Not every child has parents/caregivers who can take the time or provide the resources that are available in more affluent homes and neighbourhoods.

The PLAYhouse will be a multi-use, safe, fun and dynamic facility with imaginative play areas, toys, books, a child friendly kitchen, music and resources to support the learning of children under 5 years of age and their caregivers. As income and transportation issues often limit our families' opportunities to explore outside of the North End, the PLAYhouse will include field trips to Fort Whyte Nature ALIVE, Bird's Hill Park, Manitoba Theatre for Young People, camp, local farms, and recreation centres. These trips will broaden the horizons of our children and their caregivers. The PLAYhouse will be open after school hours for music programs and other artistic endeavours.

We embrace Judge Murray Sinclair's vision that Indigenous and non Indigenous need to work together towards reconciliation. The #1 call to action in the TRC is child welfare. We would like to think that the LITTLE STARS PLAYhouse is part of the solution towards reconciliation. We believe in Commissioner Ted Hughes' invitation (Phoenix Sinclair Inquiry) to become a community that views children as our shared responsibility.

Imagine our LITTLE STARS becoming the BIG STARS of the North End. The PLAYhouse will be a place where "eyes light up" for our North End Children, messes are OK, laughs get louder and FAMILIES get closer.
