As a non-audition, community choir, Margaret's Choir provides a welcoming and supportive environment for all who want to sing, whatever their experience. Singing soothes the soul and enriches the world of all who hear. Singing from the heart, the choir performs two benefit concerts each year and has raised over \$280,000, monies which have been returned to the community supporting many worthy organizations.
